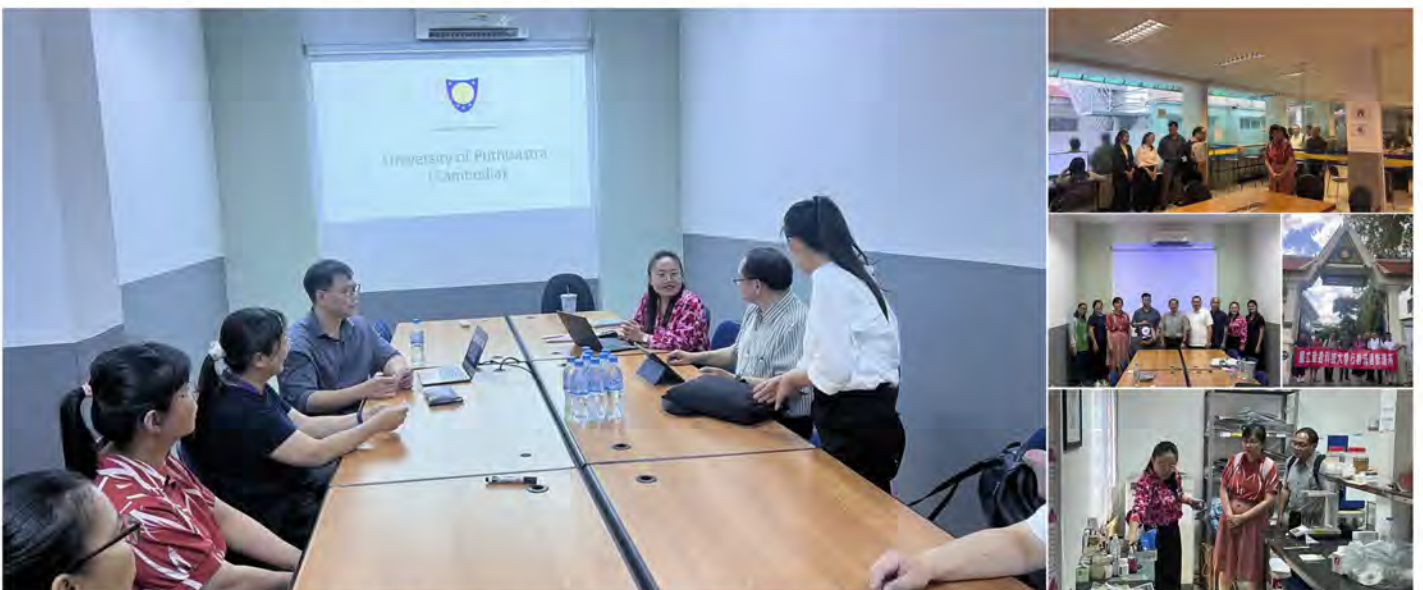

MEDICAL STUDENTS PARTICIPATED IN THE MISSION OF PROJECT SOTHEA IN BATTAMBONG PROVINCE



Twelve medical students from MD year 2 and 3 went to Battambang province for five days within the mission of Project Sothea. The purpose of this mission was to prepare the health screening for people in poor communities that will take place in December 2024. The group of students have conducted a survey with villagers and discussed with the Village Chief the organization of the event. An MoU was also established with private clinics in order to refer patients who need lab tests or imaging investigation, surgery or admission.

Education was also provided to pupils in the primary school about dental hygiene, basic hygiene, nutrition and puberty. Finally, the students have had the opportunity to visit the Handa Medical Center.

UP and Speech Therapy Cambodia (STC) are presently running a Dysphagia course for Cambodian health professionals. They have just received word that the Rotary International Foundation has extended their support for the course for two more years—through the 2025-26 academic year!

Speech-Language Pathologist Alice Smith from the USA and Speech and Language Therapist Clare Park from the UK arrived in late June to continue with the clinical supervision of the 2023-24 cohort of trainees in UP's ground-breaking "Foundations of Dysphagia Management" course.

Alice and Clare have both previously worked in Cambodia as volunteers for STC where they met and worked together for the first time in 2018. So both are delighted to have been able to return to assist with this course and to see how dysphagia services are being developed in the local hospitals here.

There are currently 13 trainees completing the UP course. The course will be completed by the first week in October when the program will restart with a new cohort of trainees.

UP DENTISTRY CELEBRATES IN LONDON

Dr. LAO Ryna was awarded a post-graduate diploma in Clinical orthodontics from the City of London Dental School and the University of Bolton, UK.

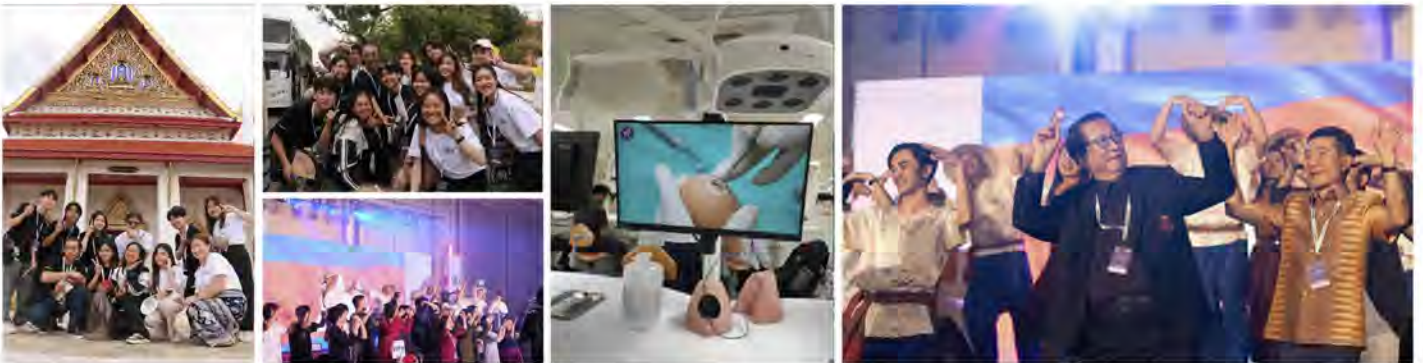

This two-year program was organized by the Orthosociety in collaboration with these institutions. Dentists from numerous countries participated, including those from Singapore, Malaysia, Taiwan, Indonesia, Hong Kong, and Thailand. Dr. Lao Ryna was distinguished as the only female participant from Cambodia.

Each candidate was required to complete both theoretical and practical components of the orthodontic course. This included a comprehensive entry examination, the submission of ten completed cases, a final matriculation exam, and an oral case presentation conducted by the University of Bolton.

Professor Anand Marya, our Head of the Department of Orthodontics at UP, was the local mentor for the program and provided invaluable guidance to Dr. Lao Ryna throughout. Dr. Lao Ryna successfully completed the program and attended the graduation ceremony at the University of Bolton.

UP CONDUCTS FOURTH CPD ONLINE COURSE FOR 624 PHARMACISTS ACROSS CAMBODIA



The Faculty of Pharmacy has organized an online professional development training course for Cambodian pharmacists approved by the Pharmacy Council of Pharmacists with a total of 624 participants over four days under the theme "Good Practices in Drug Distribution and Standards of Practice (SOPs) "This training is taught by Mr. Phalla Sovanrith, Program Manager of the Vennue Foundation (NGO) and all participants will receive 5 points after graduation.

The training aims to provide a comprehensive understanding of Good Dispensing Practice, including its definition and the qualities of a Good Dispenser, as well as the importance of a clean distribution environment and effective organization. Participants will learn to identify key steps in the drug distribution process and review the "Five Rights" of pharmacy practice.

Practical methods will be discussed to ensure proper drug distribution is integrated into everyday pharmacy and healthcare practices. The training will cover the definition and importance of Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs), their distinction from Guidelines, and their functions and benefits in pharmacies. Additionally, the training will guide participants in identifying the six essential components for effective SOP writing, evaluating pharmacy or healthcare practices to determine areas that could benefit from SOPs, and reviewing recommended SOPs for implementation in pharmacies. This training is crucial for government organizations, NGOs, and private companies to enhance community safety and well-being.

UP AND ABT REWARDS LAB TECH STAFF AND STUDENTS



On August 9, 2024, the Faculty of Health Sciences and Biotechnology of the University of Puthisastra (UP) and Abt Associates Inc- Cambodia Branch, PMI Evolve Project, organized a Certificate Ceremony for participant staff and students of the Laboratory Science Department, who completed the Molecular and Laboratory Techniques Capacity Strengthening Programme which was held at the UP.

The trainers are the specialists Entomologist of the PMI Evolve Project and the training was focused on the three topics described below:

1. The Basic Morphology and Anatomy of Anopheles Mosquitos and Bisection
2. Circumsporozoite Enzyme-Linked Immunosorbent Assay (CS ELISA) for Sporozoite Detection
3. Molecular Identification of Main Malaria Vectors in Cambodia through Polymerase Chain Reaction (PCR)

It should be noted that the training was conducted two days per week for 3 months, which started from May 8, 2024 to July 29, 2024.

SEMINAR ON “STUDY ON EFFECTS AND MECHANISMS OF ACETIC ACID BACTERIA ON INTESTINAL IMMUNOGLOBULIN A”



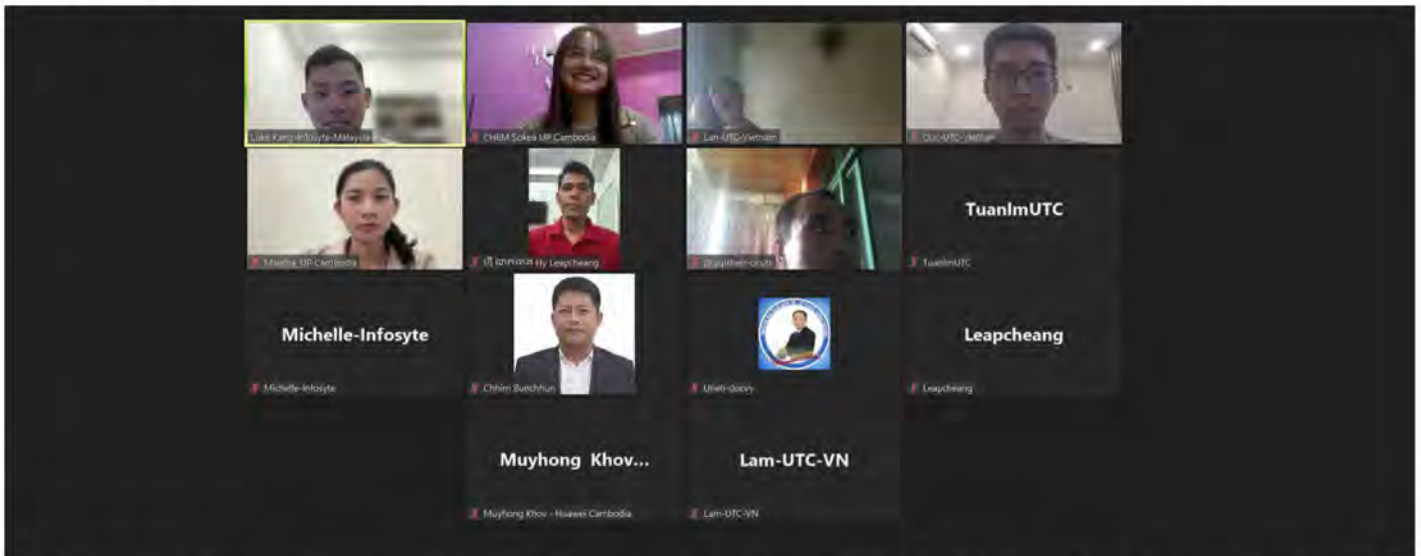
On Monday, 12nd August 2024, UPs Faculty of Health Sciences and Biotechnology organized a seminar on “Study on Effects and Mechanisms of Acetic Acid Bacteria on Intestinal Immunoglobulin A”.

The seminar was held via an online platform (Google Meet).

The guest speaker was Ms. Heng Sokleap, a MEXT scholar in the Laboratory of Food Chemistry, at Hiroshima University. This seminar was organized to share information related to screening acetic acid bacteria that could induce IgA production in the intestine, elucidating mechanisms of IgA induction using murine Peyer's patches, and identifying the active component as IgA inducers.

After the seminar ended, all participants learned and gained a lot of knowledge and experience from our invited speaker.

HUAWEI TRAINING ON HCIA-CLOUD-SERVICE V3.5



In a critical step towards improving the cloud computing skill, Faculty of ICT and ICT part time lecturers have joined a specialized training program by Huawei. The training, focused on HCIA-Cloud-Service V3.5, took place from July 29 to August 2, 2024. The five-day training session was part of Huawei's global initiative to bridge the gap between academic knowledge and industry requirements. It was designed to equip lecturers with in-depth knowledge of cloud services, enabling them to integrate the latest cloud technologies into their teaching and research. The successful completion of the HCIA-Cloud-Service V3.5 training is expected to have a positive ripple effect on the ICT programs. Students will benefit from the enhanced expertise of their teaching, gaining knowledge that is not only theoretical but also practical and industry-relevant.

ANATOMY CLASSES AND ACTIVITIES FROM FY



The Anatomy course in the Foundation Year programme is designed to help students master the fundamentals of human anatomy.

The course involves a systematic study of the body in five different categories: the foundation of the body; systems for covering, support, and movement; systems for control and regulation; systems for maintenance; and the system for continuity.

This semester, the anatomy course included practical lessons with the anatomical models in the labs. This provided students with hands-on experience in identifying and understanding each structure of the integumentary, skeletal, muscular, and respiratory systems.

By manipulating the anatomical structures, students were able to gain a deeper understanding of the spatial relationships between organs, tissues, and body systems, as well as their function.

This was a great experience for students and a good way to reinforce what they had learned about these systems.
